

**Shaw Islanders, Incorporated**  
**Minutes from the Town Hall Meeting**  
**October 7, 2006**

The Annual Town Hall Meeting began at 2:00 pm with Jerry Molitor acting as moderator. Each speaker was given five minutes to speak about their organization in an effort to keep the meeting to two hours. Thirty-five people were in attendance.

Following is a list of speakers in the order they presented:

1. Carolyn Haugen, Superintendent, for the Shaw Island School. Carolyn spoke of school activities and announced that Friday December 15 is the date for the Christmas Program.
2. Terri Mason, Owner, for the Shaw General Store. Terri asked for support from island residents in supporting the store, especially during the winter months.
3. Brud Joslin, Fire Chief, for the Shaw Island Fire Department. Brud announced the new regulations for burn permits.
4. Helen Riggins for the Emergency Medical Services section of the Shaw Island Fire Department. Helen told of the EMT training this year and the Wilderness Training. She appealed to those who have not done so to get their street numbers posted by their driveways.
5. Bill Frasier, Treasurer of the Shaw Island Library and Historical Society.
6. Maggie Savage spoke about Shaw Respect. She said they were able to give 5 scholarships this year. The “tag sale” is held each Labor Day weekend to support the scholarships.
7. Bill Reeve told about the activities of the Shaw Landing Association. He thanked the Wedgwoods for getting the organization back on its feet. He also told about the planned development at the property by the ferry dock.
8. Carole Davis told of 4-H activities.
9. Lola Deane spoke on two subjects—the Last Wednesday Community Lunch and the Shaw Island County Park which is part of the San Juan County Parks system. The Christmas Boutique to benefit the Last Wednesday Lunch will be held on November 18 from 9:30 am until noon at the community building.
10. Jon Shannon spoke of activities concerning the SJC Public Works Department. No major projects are expected soon. The recycling center is working well.
11. Jerry read a letter from Alice Nelsen, President of the Cemetery Board. The cemetery is sold out and would like to buy back lots not expected to be used.
12. Cy Field spoke of the proposed By-Law changes that may be presented in the Fall Newsletter.
13. Janice Ekstrom, President of Shaw Inc., told of some of the activities this year. She encouraged anyone interested in serving on the board of trustees next year to contact her and she thanked Ray Glaze for his service in maintaining the Shaw Inc. website.

Questions and discussion was held until the end of the meeting.

Jerry Molitor announced the time for the Shaw Community Fellowship and encouraged anyone interested to attend.

Terri Mason suggested a phone tree might be helpful for sharing time-critical information with island residents. This idea was met with much support.

Cookies and cider and conversation followed the meeting. The meeting was adjourned about 3:30 pm.
